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Prerequisites

The student should have basic knowledge on the state system at the level of secondary school graduation, have the ability to think logically and practical skills in the search for basic literature available in print and in the Internet, understand the importance of legal and institutional regulatory mechanisms in social life and the economy.

Course objective

Providing students with basic knowledge on the legal system and branches of law.

Course-related learning outcomes

Knowledge

The student discusses the structure and types of legal norms, including their validity in time and space, and identifies sources of universally binding national law [P6S_WG_02].



The student characterizes the institutional and legal system of the European Union and the structures and institutions of administration at the EU and national levels [P6S_WG_05].

The student compares different types of network economic structures and analyzes the relationships between participants in these networks [P6S_WG_11].

The student explains basic aspects of criminal law, including the concept and characteristics of a crime and the principles of criminal liability [P6S_WG_18].

Skills

The student analyzes entities in a legal relationship, including natural persons, legal persons, and so-called defective legal persons, and assesses their legal capacity and capacity to perform legal actions [P6S_UW_01].

The student interprets legal actions, their types and forms, and indicates defects in declarations of intent [P6S_UW_06].

The student applies knowledge of property law to analyze the characteristics of property rights, including ownership rights and land registers [P6S_UW_07].

The student utilizes knowledge of jurisprudence to solve specific tasks related to management, including issues related to labor law [P6S_UW_08].

Social competences

The student demonstrates awareness of the importance of professional conduct, adherence to professional ethics, and respect for the diversity of opinions and cultures in the context of law and management [P6S_KR_02].

Methods for verifying learning outcomes and assessment criteria

Learning outcomes presented above are verified as follows:

Formative assessment: discussions summarizing particular lectures and tutorials, solving legal problems during the classes that offers the opportunity to assess the student's understanding of the issues raised.

Summative assessment: the knowledge acquired in tutorials is verified in a written test carried out in the last class. The knowledge acquired in lectures is verified in a written exam.

Programme content

Introduction to jurisprudence - legal system, branches of law, composition and types of legal norms, application of legal norms in time and space.

Sources of national universally-binding national law - law making, hierarchy. Competences of the Constitutional Tribunal. Rules for lodging a constitutional complaint.

The institutional and legal system of the European Union. EU law - primary and secondary.



Justice system in Poland. Elements of civil proceedings.
